The Greyhound Diner

Chicken Liver Cookies

2 c. flour
3 T. vegetable oil
1 c. wheat germ
1 egg, lightly beaten
1/2 c. chicken broth
2 tsp. chopped parsley
1 c. chopped chicken liver, cooked

Preheat oven to 400F.

Combine flour and cornmeal. In separate bowl, beat egg with oil, then add broth and parsley, mix well. Add dry ingredients to bowl a little at a time, stirring well. Fold in chicken livers and mix well. Dough will be firm. Turn dough out on lightly floured surface and knead briefly. Roll out 1/2" thick and cut into shapes. Place on greased cookie sheet 1" apart.

Bake 15 minutes or until firm. Store in refrigerator.

An Irish speaker told me how to "truly" pronounce his name but for the sake of my sanity decided to stick with my version.

Everywhere a Flea Flea!

The flea season will arrive soon. Now comes the question, "Which product is the safest for greyhounds?" Greyhounds are very sensitive to many pesticides, so owners must be extremely careful in regard to what flea products are used. Their bodies metabolize these substances different from other dogs. When treating greyhounds for fleas extreme care must be taken - **there is simply no margin for error.** The chemical compounds found in various flea shampoos, dips, and sprays can be equally deadly. A good rule of thumb is if the product is safe for puppies and kittens, it is safe for greyhounds.

In the past few years, huge changes have taken place in regard to the chemicals used to eliminate fleas. The products are getting safer for cats and dogs and more deadly to the fleas.

Here is a list of 5 Flea/Tick products that are safe:

- Program - monthly pill
- Advantage - monthly contact to skin
- Frontline - both fleas & ticks
- Sentinel - fleas and worms
- Preventic (for ticks only, it is a collar but is safe for greyhounds)
