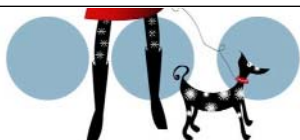
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Editors Note

5000 Years of Racing History

Greyhounds are thought to be the oldest breed of dog. They have been bred to chase for close to 5000 years so the instinct is there in every greyhound. It could be buried deep but sometime, somewhere the trigger could go off. Keep your greyhounds safe.

Tattoos & Your Greyhound

The breeder tattoos greyhound pups at 3 months of age. It is, of course, permanent identification of each greyhound. The right ear tells the month and year the dog was born as well as the order in the litter in which he was tattooed. The first number is the month of birth, the second is the last digit of the year and the last is the order of tattooing. The order is not always in order of birth. If the tattoo reads 24C then the dog was born in February 1994 and was the 3rd of the litter to be tattooed. The left ear has their National Greyhound Association identification number. This number is unique to each greyhound.

Now having said all that I have to say that this is obviously not always the case as my guy has NMR in his left ear and TM in his right ear.

Greyhounds and Track Names

Your greyhound will come with a name but will probably not respond to it. Most trainers will not use the track name as they don't want the distractions of people calling their name during a race. So don't have misgivings about wanting to change their name. Let's face it, there are some track names that just are not suitable for calling out in public.

Greyhounds & Swimming

Greyhounds are not very good swimmers. Due to their low percentage of body fat they tend to sink. It is worth remembering that greyhounds have probably never seen a pool and don't realize that it isn't solid.

It took me one whole summer to convince my guy that it was safe to step into pond water and yes he could drink it. Five years later he will walk in water but only until the water touches his belly. It is amusing to watch him walk through water as he raises each leg over the surface of the water for each step and this becomes quite comical as the water gets deeper.

Massage

Everyone loves a massage, including your greyhound. Usually they will just stand there in absolute bliss sometimes raising their long necks so you can better reach the good spots.

I have read that greyhounds like their noses rubbed. I can't say I have spent much time rubbing my dogs nose but he certainly has spent considerable time rubbing his nose on me. Usually immediately after eating he will happily rub his nose back and forth across my back end and if I am not available he will make do with the sofa.

Reverse Sneezing

Reverse What! Have you ever heard your grey making disturbing snorting, honking and gasping noises? It is quite upsetting as it seems like they are having some sort of attack or choking. Not to worry! Well not too much! This is known as a reverse sneeze and is a spasm caused by an irritation of the soft palate. The soft palate is a soft, fleshy tissue extension off the roof of the mouth. It really has nothing to do with sneezing. During the spasm, the dog will usually turn her elbows outward and extend her neck while gasping inwards with a distinctive snorting sound. Gently massaging the throat area or pinching the dog's nostrils shut so she must breathe through her mouth can help shorten the episode. Sometimes taking the dog outside in the fresh air stops the spasm. Once the attack ceases, all goes back to normal.

Frosty Paws

1 quart vanilla yogurt
1 medium banana
2 T peanut butter (I use natural style)
2 T honey

- Puree the banana in a food processor (a blender would probably work fine).
- Add the peanut butter and honey and continue processing until smooth.
- Add yogurt and process just long enough to blend all ingredients together.
- Place 18 small paper cups (bathroom size) in a baking pan (one 9x13 or two 8x8 work well).
- Fill paper cups to about 2/3 full. An ice cream scoop or a measuring cup makes the job easier.
- Freeze until solid. Transfer the frozen treats to zip-lock bags for storing in the freezer.

Greenie® Warning

This is a story that we hope is going to have a happy ending and we're working hard to make that happen. Still, we can't delay in sending out this Greenie alert!

Solo and Zephie were given a gift of four Greenies at Christmas. We weren't familiar with these tooth-cleaning "treats", so we looked on the Greenies.com web site and decided that they sounded like a good solution for cleaner teeth and fresher breath. Our dogs loved them, so I went back on-line to see where we could buy more. Instead, I turned up a raft of reports on how dangerous they are. They have caused quite a few deaths and a company spokesperson says that Greenies are only 85% digestible.

In early January, Solo developed a major case of the runs that has persisted for 6 weeks now. Several tests failed to turn anything up. The diarrhea was bad enough, but then Solo became unable to eat. Our vet Chris Somerville did barium X-rays and found that Solo's spleen had gone into torsion. Chris removed the spleen and discovered a suspicious-looking, thickened section of intestine near the stomach. He sent a tissue sample to the vet college at UPEI for analysis. After much study and deliberation, a team of pathologists concluded that a "foreign body" had lodged in Solo's intestines or perforated the intestinal wall, causing the inflammation. Chris had done a thorough exploratory and felt confident that Solo had passed

Solo is now on steroids to reduce the
inflammation and we hope, straighten things out.

We are certain that Solo hasn't eaten anything indigestible other than the Greenies. He and Zephie like to sniff around outside, but they never pick up sticks or anything at all, for that matter, and we never give them anything to eat that isn't crunchy and crumbly. While we have no absolute confirmation that the Greenie caused Solo's problems, we believe it. Maybe you've already heard about the dangers of Greenies (or Greenie wanna-be's). There are many reports on-line about the poor dogs and cats who have died from them. Greenies® More Information

In the December issue of Greymatters we noted the concern with the pet product known as Greenies®. These products are advertised to help clean dogs' teeth as they chew on them.

The Greenie® website, www.greenies.com, does respond to the current bad press and their response maintains that their products are safe if their feeding guidelines are followed correctly. They recommend that Greenies® Large is the size that should be fed to a 50 - 100lb dog. They do offer a warning that states: "*As with any edible product, monitor your dog to ensure the treat is adequately chewed. Gulping any item can be harmful or even fatal to a dog.*" Here lies the problem, dogs are not noted to be thorough chewers. I wonder sometimes why they even have teeth. Product information says that Greenies® are 100% edible, they do not claim they are 100% digestible. The site states that "*There is no food, human or pet, that is 100% digestible.*" It is those undigested pieces that may be the cause of blockages and may lead to serious problems.

Please do some reading and consider having your hound tested.....The blood samples will be going to Protatek in Arizona, this is a very reputable lab that specializes in this. Because antibiotics often give a "masked" result, you

should not have your dog tested if they have been on antibiotics or prednazone within 6 months of the testing date.

Hound Day Cometh!

Help is Needed.

I have an updated list on tasks needed to be completed and items needed to be donated. Please read below:

Volunteers needed for the following tasks on April 1/06:

- Remove everything from the kennel and CLEAN IT
- Scrub siding & rake yard
- Dig the sawdust away from the fence and insert 2x4's
- Build shelving units in back room fix holes in tarp.
- Install gates(to create a screen door) in kennel
- Clean and vac walls & paint walls scrub floors scrub kennels
- Sort crates for sale
- Count paper shredded in bags
- Caulk windows and openings in walls etc with expansion foam
- Fix siding around newly installed window

Donations needed for kennel for April 1/06:

- 1 FIRM bristled broom Large
- 12 mouse traps with or without cheese or live mouse traps with a list of foster homes
- 1 box rags or a few bags of rags for cleaning
- 24 rolls paper towels
- 6 scrub brushes a light for the back storage room and an electrical to install it
- 12 plus old towels (to be used for dogs)

An on going supply of at least 3 bottles of each of the following are needed immediately... :

- Javex, & mr clean(or oxi gel) windex industrial sized garbage bags (drum liners kent / home depot) 200 large garbage bags 100 +
- 10 Large Bags of Shavings
- 1 New Rake
- Several sheets of plywood or drywall or whatever to finish walls and ceiling in kennel. (I would ask Cheryl about this.. she is our handy person and has great suggestions)
- 8 2x4 for around the bottom of the fence
- 45 cans of latex not oil white paint
- clock radio (small)
- 2 large sheets (4x6?) of 3/4 " ply wood for replacement of crate bottoms
- Oscillating fans (large/ tall)
- Insulating styro foam for door of kennel.

- Rubber gloves for cleaning/ not surgical we actually have lots of these
- 2 77 + liter rubber or plastic garbage cans with lids for dog food.
- 3 (stronger / industrial) solar lights for back of kennel bldg
- 6 tubes of expansion foam
- 2 gates (same as for a yard) and hardware to make a screen door for kennel.
- 6 rectal / oral thermometers
- 2 tubes petroleum jelly
- 5 tubes polysporin
- A few bags of stuffed animals for the dogs
- 4 bottles liquid bandage (same as for humans)
- 2 bottles bufferine
- 2 packages of immodium tablets/ pepto bismol etc
- 4 rolls cotton gauze
- 1 large bag cotton balls
- 2 bottles peroxide
- 1 bottle iodine
- old muzzles and collars please

We REALLY need your help with this one so PLEASE come out and lend a hand. LOTS OF VOLUNTEERS NEEDED ON A REGULAR BASIS PLEASE.

There's a board in the kennel which will have various tasks listed on it. If no one is around, look at the board and it will indicate what needs to be done. You don't have to do the entire list but if you could help with one or two things, we'd really appreciate that. Remember to cross off the things you've done when you leave the kennel so that the next person coming in will know what's already been done.

If you're a little unsure of what to do because you haven't got much experience with some of the "to do" list requests, feel free to follow this list instead:

Daily tasks:

- Assisting with feeding and turning the dogs out
- changing soiled paper
- Changing full garbage bags turnouts every 4-5 hours throughout the day.
- Play time individually in the yard walks rake yard grooming(nails teeth brushing etc)
- General obedience (learning to walk on a lead.. etc)

 - Scrub filthy carpet ends and hang over fence to dry. anything else that I have listed on the to do list ...

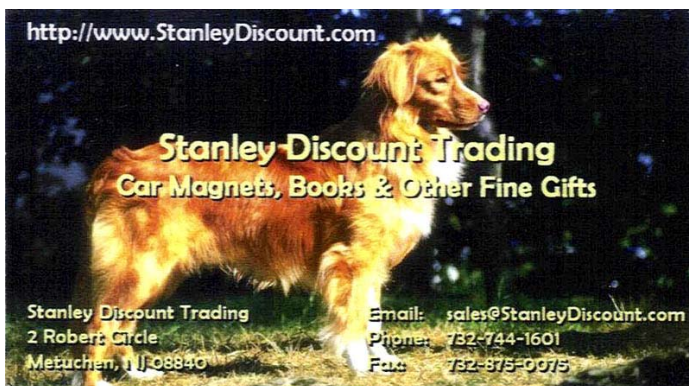
Weekly tasks:

- Wash, vac holes, and change or add paper if needed check for ticks and fleas / spray as necessary groom ing of dogs
- scrub floors and feeding stations, shelving , dust etc
- Change water in pool (as needed) scrub pool wash out all food and water bowls and refill food containers
- Check for invasions of mice and other critters by moving items away from walls and in the back room etc.. set traps as needed
- Laundry .. wash towels (anyone can take these home to wash and then return)
- Add bags of shavings to yard
- Check kennel and yard for maintance needsanything else that is listed.
