Ranking of Dogs for Obedience/Working Intelligence by Breed

Based on a dog trainer's survey.

Have you wondered what the average intelligence of a Greyhound is?

Well according to a survey I found while visiting the website www.petrix.com the Greyhound falls at # 46 of 79. They tie this spot with the Tibetan Spaniel, English Foxhound, Otterhound, American Foxhound and the Wirehaired Pointing Griffon.

The test is of the Average Working/Obedience Intelligence. #46 means that the Understanding of New Commands takes 25 - 40 repetitions and Obey on 1st Command 50% of the time or better.

Nobody will be surprised to find out that the Border Collie ranks #1, with the Understanding of New Commands taking 5 repetitions and the Obey on 1st Command 95% or better.

Anyone who has ever met an Afghan Hound will not be surprised that this breed is #79. Understanding of New Commands taking 80 - 100 repetitions and Obey on 1st Command 25 % or worse.
