


And the Greyhound was fruitful and multiplied.

Cheesy Dog Biscuit Treats

Ingredients:

1 cup rolled oats

1/3 cup margarine

1 cup Boiling water

3/4 cup cornmeal

1 tablespoons sugar

2 teaspoons chicken or beef flavored instant bouillon

1/2 cup milk

1 cup shredded cheddar cheese

1 egg, beaten

2 - 3 cups whole wheat flour.

Preheat your oven to 325 degrees. Grease cookie sheets.

In large bowl, combine rolled oats, margarine and boiling water; let stand 10 minutes. Stir in cornmeal, sugar, bouillon, milk, cheese and egg; mix well. Lightly spoon flour into measuring cup; level off. Add flour 1 cup at a time, mixing well after each addition to form a stiff dough.

On floured surface, knead in remaining flour until dough is smooth and no longer sticky, 3 to 4 minutes. Roll or pat out dough to 1/2 inch thickness, cut with bone shaped cookie cutter. Place 1 inch apart on greased cookie sheets. Bake at 325 degrees for 35 to 45 minutes on until golden brown. Cool completely. Store loosely covered. Makes 3 1/2 dozen large dog biscuits or 8 dozen small dog biscuits.

Common Greyhound Conditions

Bald Thighs

It is not unusual to see Greyhounds with not a bit of fur on their back ends. It is not known exactly what causes the problem but the result is mostly a cosmetic concern, unless you live in a climate with severe winters. It has not been linked with hypothyroidism. I have heard that bald thighs are a result of wear on metal kennels during the dogs racing career. I have not been able to substiantiate this during my on-line research. After stating this I will mention that my greyhound arrived off the track with not a hair on his back end but did grow it back within 6 months.

Comedones

Comedones are those black achne like bumps that are sometimes found on the chest area of Greyhounds. Sometimes it looks almost like your grey is going moldy. This is usually a cosmetic problem and not a cause of undo concern. Some more advanced cases may need some treatment, especially if infection sets in.

Happy Tail

Happy Tail is an injury as a result of vigerous tail wagging. Anyone reading this who is not familiar with greyhounds are now scratching their heads, but those of us who have experienced this are thinking of clean-up on par with a murder scene.

Greyhounds have long delicate tails and skin that is thinner than other breeds. The result is that their skin can tear fairly easily. Tail wagging against a hard surface, like a door frame, can crack the skin. Surprisingly this doesn't seem to hurt much cause they keep on wagging that tail. It is astonishing the results a little bit of blood and vigerous tail wagging can cause. I have personally wiped blood off the ceiling, walls, floor, and door from a tiny cut.

The first thing to do is stop the bleeding and the tail wagging. Try a soft bandage to protect the tail and your home. It will need to be lightweight or will simply come off during the next tail wag. Monitor the condition and seek veteranary help if needed.

Part two of this problem is how to clean all the blood off the walls and carpet, etc. The website mentioned at the end of this article suggests hydrogen peroxide.

Osteosarcoma

Osteosarcoma is bone cancer. A high percentage is found in the legs and shoulders. The cancer starts inside the bone causing intermittent lameness and eventually causes severe pain. It weakens the bones to a point where they can fracture quite easily.

An x-ray can provide a diagnosis but early cases may trickier to determine. A definitive diagnosis can be obtained through a bone biopsy.

Treatments for Osteosarcoma are two part - pain relief and cancer treatment. Discuss options with your vet, research the topic and search your soul for strength.

Cancer research is ongoing and one of the organizations is the University of Michigan, they are conducting a genetic study. If your Greyhound develops osteosarcoma you can consider the donation a small blood sample to this study. For further information on this please refer to the web site noted at the end of this article.

Seperation Anxiety

Most newly adopted greyhounds are not used to being alone. The fear of being separated is sometimes overwhelming.

Seperation anxiety can result in a variety of unwanted behaviours from urinating on your laundry basket to chewing up the furniture and everything inbetween. It is not believed this is a conscious effort to punish the owner but a result of panic at being left alone.

Most dogs who suffer this anxiety exhibit the symptoms every time you leave no matter how long you are gone. It is thought that the greyhound who never leaves your side when you are home may be more likely to show symptoms of anxiety when you leave.

It is believed that leaving your pet alone for some period each day, right from the beginning is a good idea.

Even a dog who seemed settled can show signs of seperation anxiety after an upsetting event in their lives. Moving to a new home, boarding while you are away, etc. Having said that we had the opposite reaction when we moved to a new home, my greyhound's seperation anxiety stopped when we moved. At our last home my greyhound would cry if he was inside and we were outside; even if he could see us.

Solving the problem will take some time and patience. Each dog is different and what works for one may not for another. Here are some things to try.

- •Avoid eye contact or interaction with your grey for about 30minutes before you leave and 30 minutes after you return. Don't let them think that you going out or coming home is really that big a deal.
- •We usually do the same thing every time we go out and our dogs are watching. We get boots, keys, coats, etc. and almost always go out the same door. Try going through the routine and then put everything away again, then try leaving through a different door. Your dog's anxiety was building as he is watching the familiar routine and this pattern building up and not leading to the usual panic state can lessen the effect of the anxiety.
- •Try leaving for extremely short times. Go out the door walk around the car then come back in. This time you came back before the panic took hold. Don't forget to ignore the dog when you come back. Remember the part about patience! Well results won't happen overnight but by gradually lengthing your departure times you should see results.
- •Try leaving the radio on.
- •Some dogs may feel more secure crated, while others may not.
- •Greyhounds may enjoy the company of another greyhound but this shouldn't be the main reason for adopting a second greyhound.

What not to do.

•Never punish your dog for the results of seperation anxiety. You will end up making the situation worse.

If your dog is not responding to your efforts you can seek help from professionals in your community. If you are unsure where to go ask your vet, they will probably have suggestions or contacts.

Symmetrical Lupoid Onychodystrophy

This is the condition where your dog looses an entire toe nail. Initially you may think he caught it in something but after examining the other nails you may notice that they don't look normal. Nails may seem loose, tender or otherwise abnormal.

Symmetrical Lupoid Onychodystrophy is an autoimmune dissease that targets the toe nails. The body actually makes antibodies against itself, and rejects it; in this case the toe nail. Sometimes SLO is misdiaganoised as an infection. SLO should be treated as an immune disorder. Treatment may be long term. Consult your vet if you notice these problems. Don't be afraid to suggest your suspicions of SLO.

Signs of the SLO are:

- •nail loss
- •licking nails
- •oozing around the base of the nail
- •limping
- infection

The good news is, it is treatable. In some cases it may be caused by severe allergies to food and diet restrictions may solve the problem. There may be over the counter medicatons that may help so ask your vet.

Canine Blood donors

Greyhounds are often thought to be universal blood donors, but this is not always the case. The universal blood type is Deal.1 and not all greyhounds have it.

Donor dogs should be screened for tick-borne diseases, must be heartworm negative and you should let the clinic know if there has been a past infection.

Greyhounds with the right blood type do make excellent donors because they have an unusually high number of red blood cells.

Your dog does not have to be sedated to give blood and it takes about 10 minutes. 10 minutes that could save another animal.
