



On Returned Greyhounds



When I lie on his bed to cuddle with him, he snuggles in to me and practically purrs with happiness. He is the canine equivalent of Valium.

With a click on the "Send" button, my application to adopt a Greyhound was on its way. After much longing and drooling over the beautiful animals I'd seen at the Meet and Greets at the mall, I would soon be the proud owner of one of my very own. In anticipation, I bought books and scrutinized every website I could find that dealt with adopting a racing Greyhound. I was confident that there was nothing that could happen that I wasn't prepared for.

The phone call I waited for came one evening in the fall of 2003. It was Lynnane Furlong, the GPAC branch rep here in Newfoundland, telling me they had a dog for me. There was just one thing - he was being returned by his owners. Now that I wasn't prepared for!

Returned! I immediately envisioned a department store clothing rack, crammed with zipperless pants and sloppily sewn clothes bearing "Oops, we goofed!" tags. I had thoughts of Wal-Mart customer service clerks carelessly tossing returned merchandise over their shoulders to be piled forlornly in carts behind them. I couldn't help but wonder what could be wrong with this dog that a family had decided to give him back.

It was love at first sight when I went to pick him up. His soulful eyes stole my heart, and within minutes of bringing him home, I couldn't imagine myself - or anyone, for that matter - ever returning him. I changed his name to "Pharaoh", which perfectly suited this regal and serene Grey. He loves to go for walks, and stays right by my side. He takes a treat from my fingers with careful precision.

I soon came to realize just why he had been returned - it was because he was meant to be my dog. I often wonder who adopted whom. He was just what I needed in my life, and I thank God every day for this sweet soul.

An email was circulated by GPAC last fall, notifying everyone that 2 senior Greyhounds were being returned by their owners after 8 years. Despite the fact that she was 11 years old, I jumped at the chance to adopt Spanky, who came prancing into our home and our hearts. Not quite knowing what to expect by adopting an "elderly" grey, imagine my delight at receiving the gift of this energetic dog with the sparkling personality! Spanky makes me laugh, while Pharaoh makes me smile.

No longer does the thought of a "returned" Greyhound leave me wondering what's wrong with the dog; I know now that it was the circumstances of the owner that prompted the return. When I walk my Greys, we are invariably stopped by curious people who want to see a Greyhound up close and find out about them. One of the first questions they ask is "Did you rescue these dogs?" I never quite know how to answer that one. I could say, "Well, they were actually rescued twice..." Or I could be truly honest and say "No, they rescued me..." Instead, I just look down into those two beautiful faces, smile, and say "Yes."

What are Fleas?

Fleas are external, blood-sucking parasites of dogs, cats, pigs, rodents, rabbits, people, birds. Adult fleas bite the host animal, sucking blood and sometimes, transmitting diseases and/or other parasites, human and cat/dog tapeworms, other worms. Bites are painful, cause local itching, produce intense discomfort and at times secondary infection (due to excessive self trauma from scratching), especially in animals particularly sensitive (allergic) to flea saliva.

Once the adult flea lands on a host animal, egg production begins 24-48 hours later. About 40-50 eggs per day are laid and fall off the animal into the environment almost immediately. Since reproduction occurs on the animal, control of reproduction on the animal is the first step in controlling the flea population on the premesis. For those real trivia buffs there are 2 species of fleas; the cat flea and the dog flea and you really need a microscope to tell the difference. The dog flea is found mostly in Europe so if your dog has had fleas it most likely is a cat flea.

Life Cycle

There are four stages: the egg, larva, pupa, and adult. To rid our homes and pets of fleas, this cycle must be broken. You can kill all the adult fleas and still have a big problem because all those eggs left by them will soon be adults, and your problem starts all over! Think about this - a pair of fleas can produce 20,000 fleas in three months!!

Fleas and Greyhounds

As we know, greyhounds are extremely sensitive to many pesticides. Their bodies metabolize these substances different from other dogs. When treating greyhounds for fleas extreme care must be taken - there is simply no margin for error. The chemical compounds found in various flea shampoos, dips, and sprays can be equally deadly. A good rule of thumb is if the product is safe for puppies and kittens, it is safe for greyhounds.

Most insecticides can be grouped into one of three families:

- Organophosphates an example is Dursban
- · Carbamates example is Sevin

These first two can NEVER be used on Greyhounds.

The third and least toxic is pyrethrin. Pyrethrin is a natural substance derived from the chrysanthemum flower. Pyrethroids (permethrin, allethrin, and resmethrin) are man-made equivalents. These are strong enough to kill most fleas but have a very low toxicity level for animals.

Others to avoid are the chemicals cythiolate, propoxur and fenthion. (Brand names are Rabon, Baygon, ProSpot, ExSpot, etc.) These are over-the-counter products you can buy at any pet store. They are applied monthly to the spine of the dog. These are too strong for greyhounds.

Flea Control Products that are safe for Greyhounds

Frontline has an additional benefit for those living in tick-infested areas, because it kills both fleas and ticks. Frontline also comes in two different forms: a spray and "topspot." Directions on the spray tell you to be in a well-ventilated room and to wear latex gloves. (That makes me wonder) When the dog's coat is damp all over you then massage the coat well so that the product gets down to the skin. Topspot comes in a liquid and is applied in the same method used for Advantage. Frontline has been used on greyhounds with safety. Frontline is another insect growth regulator - it blocks the central nervous system of fleas and ticks. One application continues killing fleas and ticks for 30 to 60 days. (Note: Advantage is not recommended for Greyhounds so please double check with your vet on this one.)

Preventic is designed like a flea collar except it kills ticks, not fleas, and it is safe for greyhounds The chemical used is Amitraz - it is the only currently approved compound that actually interferes with a tick's ability to attach to the dog. If living in a high-risk area for ticks, Preventic is certainly recommended. Another thing we were all warned about was the possibility of tick borne diseases

with our greyhounds. For this reason greyhound owners are very diligent about keeping ticks away from the greys.

Insect Development Inhibitors - Lufenuron - Program & Sentinel

Lufenuron inhibits the formation of chitin...the external skeleton of fleas. It does NOT kill the adult fleas, and the exact mechanisms of inhibition are not known (the manufacturer has not explained these). Adult female fleas ingest the product during a blood meal; the flea's eggs are then rendered sterile...they can not develop into other stages. The product is given orally (pill or liquid) monthly or as a long-acting (6 month duration) injectable preparation. It is considered very safe for puppies and kittens 6 weeks or older.

Program is the first once-a-month flea control tablet for dogs. Program is an insect growth regulator. By breaking the fleas' life cycle, the fleas are unable to reproduce. If your pet already has fleas, you may want to use another product in conjunction with Program for the first month, as Program does not kill the adult fleas who have already taken a bite out of your dog. After you get the current flea problem under control, Program is all you will need. Ciba-Geigy, the makers of Program, suggest you start your pet on Program early in the flea season before you start seeing fleas. One drawback with Program is that the flea must actually bite your dog before being killed, so if your dog is bothered by "fleabite allergic dermatitis" (itchiness from fleabites), Program won't stop the itching. Program should always be given with or immediately following a meal to insure proper absorption.

Sentinel tablets are the only medication that protects against heartworms, fleas, roundworms, hookworms and whipworms. One tablet given once monthly with meals gives dogs the most complete protection possible in a single tablet. Program and Interceptor, a heartworm preventive, are combined in one tablet - the result is Sentinel. The life cycle at the egg and larval stage is interrupted thereby killing the fleas. Sentinel should be given on a full stomach.

Non-Chemical

To avoid using any chemicals you can always try the flea comb any follow the instructions on the package.

Conclusion

My advice would be to Read Labels, avoid all those overthe-counter products you can buy at any pet department, don't apply anything topical to the spine of the dog and if you are unsure call your vet.

Dog food delimas

What to feed our dogs? Who thought it would be so hard. Dog foods are all the same right?

Wrong!

In the past two months I have heard of three incidents where mold toxins in dog food either killed or nearly killed dogs. The manufacturers and distributors know a problem exists and some dog foods have been recalled. The problem is, the recall is voluntary so many distributors and retailers are willing to take the risk. For those of us with breeds that have a low body fat ratio, toxins are expecially worrisome. Any existing toxins can not be broken down or distributed through body fat they go to work directly on vital organs, with horrible results.

There are so many different brands out there and don't think that the big brand names are the best, they may just spend more money on advertising than manufacturing the actual dog food. Be suspicious of the real cheap stuff, it is probably cheap for a reason. Read the labels before choosing one and also take note of the first few ingregients as they should be listed in order. Be aware of the following:

- •Any sort of by-product this is the stuff that can't be used for any other purpose gros!
- •Corn meal this is mostly a filler and will end up out the other end.
- •Soy dogs can't digest it.

Check out the web sites or call the 1 800 numbers listed on packages and ask questions. Try asking them "Does your dog food contain human grade products?" or "Does your dog food use products that are fit for human consuption?" When listening to responses keep in mind that all produc-

tion facilities and food sources come from federally inspected sites no matter what the quality.

There are good dog food choices out there to meet all our needs, you just have to find the right one to work for you and your dog. You can make your own dog food, you can buy dehydrated food, or gormet products from speciality shops, you can even buy vegetarian dog food or purchase from your local pet department either way choose the best quality that works for you.

Add some variety from time to time. There is nothing wrong with table scraps, hey, you just ate it! If you want to add those greens from a salad puree them first, dogs can digest it much easier then.

Oh yeah! And to all of us who pour the dog food out of the bag into a big container - Don't do it! The dog food bags are specially designed to keep the food fresh and cut down on mold growth, etc. Most large containers are not designed to hold food.
