Remember at Kermesse on June 12/04, I introduced you to the salmon Clearwater used to raise donations for the IWK? Cheryl, it wasn't fair to make me use Tuckers collar and Codys lead to drag you away from the booth. Yes, it

was a good deal at \$2 a filet, but did you have to try and supply the IWK with a new monitor in one gulping standing? Do you remember the Spryfield Santa Claus Parade in Nov./03? You brought your grandchildren as well as your Greys. Cheryl, we don't think you should have made the kids ride on your lap while the dogs had the back seat to themselves.

Now we remember you. Never once when we saw you were you without a smile. Can't figure out how you did it. Your Mom said at your memorial service that she thought the dogs were taller than you. I said, "that's because Cheryl was always on her knees hugging and kissing them". We miss you.

Note: Cheryl was always in charge of the kitchen for Hound Days. I got to fully appreciate what she had to do at the last Hound Day, July 29/05 when I did the kitchen. Unlike Cheryl, I didn't have to lug all the food down a hill at Lake Echo to feed the troops.

When the hounds arrived that day we were given the choice of Asti Oblik or It's "R" Way. We decided on "R" Way, now known as Meggie Mey. Asti Oblik went to Newfoundland and ended up in the loving lap of Phyllis Loder. We grieved for the loss of the hound we never got to see, but loved her anyway. Phyllis and I chatted about the Asti lineage, and when I told her the story of Windfall tears came to her eyes and she gave me a hug. This meant so much to me with her having Windfall's siblings. We both agreed though that we were very happy with our choices.

It was an especially hard day for us as we knew Phyllis' time was limited. It seemed an injustice that we couldn't enjoy this dynamic lady more, but she gave us in one day what a lot of people can't give in years, true heartfelt love of something they believe in. It was short, but so incredibly sweet. Thank-you Phyllis.

In memory of a beautiful lady that carried herself with amazing grace and dignity. Remembering a lady that was so strong, remained steady in the face of adversity, and took her love of the Greyhounds to the end, knowing she had fulfilled her wish.

A Greyt Loss

When I first became a volunteer with GPAC, I never considered how I would deal with the loss of someone's greyhound, let alone the loss I would feel after losing one of our members and volunteers. Well this past Labour day, I found out. I was deeply saddened after hearing that Phyllis Loder had died after her courageous battle with cancer.

I remember when Phyllis first told me that she was sick. She was so positive and sure she could beat it. She "WOULD beat the odds", she told me. Well, Phyllis tried her best and for almost three years she put up an amazing fight. For all that time, Phyllis hid her illness well and you would not have known she was ill unless she told you. I never heard her complain and when I spoke with her in the weeks before she died, she was still "hoping for a miracle".

Over the months leading up to her death I was always amazed by Phyllis' strength. I admired that strength. Phyllis planned her own funeral and told me she did not want to have Randy to have to worry about it. She told me she felt "lucky" to be able to plan her funeral as so many do not get the opportunity. She refused any help with the dogs and when she could not do it while Randy was out of town, she hired someone to walk them three times a day, as that was their routine. She wanted to make sure they received the same level of care they had become accustomed to.

Phyllis was the type of person who easily made you smile and laugh even when she was serious. She was one of those people who viewed life with her glass half full and she could see the positive in any negative. She had a way of wanting you to see that too. When I first met Phyllis in 2001, she told me she was a cat person and had never owned a dog. She "wanted to get it right" and absorbed all the information we told her about greyhounds. Phyllis

poured her heart and soul into her greyhounds, Asti and Othello (otherwise known as "Bro"). She spared no expense when it came to her dogs and I recall many things she did for their betterment. To name a few, she had her beautiful hardwood stairs carpeted as she felt it would be easier for the dogs to walk on. She owned over fifty dog coats and the running joke was that her dogs were always better dressed at the meet and greets than any of us volunteers. She and Randy purchased a motor home to travel so the dogs would be more comfortable and she would not have to leave them behind. She was open to moving to give the dogs more room to run as she did not have a fenced yard. For that, she was prepared to give up her beloved garden that had taken her years to develop. I recall seeing her often with Randy and the dogs at Dairy Queen getting them their Sunday ice cream. I recall her once telling me she was "stuck at the ball field as Asti refused to leave!" She rented a hall to celebrate her dogs fourth birthday. She was a true and true greyhound addict! I am smiling as I fondly remember these things. This is how Phyllis should be remembered, with a smile. I was not surprised when I found out the dogs would be at the funeral home as they were her family in every sense of the word.

Phyllis was the GPAC secretary in NL for three years and a regular volunteer even after her diagnosis. One of her last wishes was to go to NS for hound day despite being ill. She was grateful for the opportunity and even returned with a foster dog that she could not resist. Despite her own struggle with cancer, she was determined to find that greyhound a home with other greys even if it meant keeping her herself. We honored her dedication and wishes, and today Trinket is with two other greyhounds here in NL. Phyllis will be greytly missed and thought of often, always with a smile!

Having adopted my first Greyhound, Pharaoh, in late 2003, I had only ever attended one picnic, which was so smoothly run by Kelley Lane. Now, I was the "rookie" responsible for organizing a similar event, and the pressure was on! I put out the call for volunteers to be my "picnic elves," and the most dedicated and enthusiastic group you could ever hope to find came to my assistance. We started meeting in May to begin brainstorming, and as the summer progressed, so did our plans.

Before long, donations were beginning to accumulate; cases of chips, soft drinks and beer were stacked in my garage, fabulous items for the Silent Auction were gathered and grouped in my living and dining rooms, and I began to feel as if this picnic just might be on track to be a success! My group of volunteers, though small in number, was huge in heart, and my house began to take on the air of excitement that I'm sure Santa's workshop has on Christmas Eve.

Sunday, August 28th was a beautiful summer's day. After a week of rain - which had made us all a little nervous, as the picnic venue was, for the most part, outdoors - we were so relieved to see the sunshine! Everything was ready, the weather cooperated - now all we needed was a good turnout! I believe it was in the Kevin Costner movie "Field of Dreams" where we hear the line "If you build it, they will come." So we built it, and come they did! We had an amazing turnout, not only of Greyhounds with their adopted families, but of the general public, who were curious to get an up-close look at these beautiful animals.

The day was a success in every sense of the word. There was lots of good-natured battling to be the top bidder on the Silent Auction items, the children were occupied with the coloring contest and face painting, and the Greys - our guests of honor - were happy to just be together, lazing on the grass, wading in the pools, and participating in games with their owners.

From my vantage point, it was truly inspiring to look around a field full of strangers brought together because of a common passion - their love for the Greyhound. To see everyone chatting and laughing, sharing Greyhound stories and comparing their dogs' antics, and just coming together to meet fellow Grey owners gave me such a good feeling. I don't think there is any other breed of dog in the world that would fuel such loyalty and devotion.

At the end of the day, the final tally brought our total amount raised to over \$3200, which made this our most financially successful picnic to date. I was finally able to breathe a sigh of relief, knowing that it was "mission accomplished" - the funds we raised will be used to further the efforts of GPAC, which makes the months of planning and preparation all worthwhile.

To each and every one of you who came out to support us at the picnic, thank you so much for making it the success it was. All the planning in the world only goes so far - it's the supporters who make it happen.

To all our donors, who so generously gave everything from gift certificates to prints, we send a huge thank you. Please know how grateful we are for your support and generosity.

To Vanessa Stockley of Granite Studios, an enormous thank you for designing and printing the beautiful posters advertising the picnic.

To Lynanne Furlong, our amazing and dedicated representative for the Newfoundland branch of GPAC, thank you for just being you. Your complete faith in a group of volunteers who offered to take on an endeavor as important as this is astonishing!

Last, but definitely not least, to the tremendous team of picnic volunteers who gave so willingly of their time, energy and enthusiasm, a Greyt big hug goes out to each and every one of you. From coming to planning meetings to seeking out donations to helping with various events at the picnic itself, you were incredible, and the success of this year's picnic is attributed to your efforts.

Newfoundland GPAC hit hard by Air Canada

In a conversation with Air Canada rep's last night I have been informed of a new airline policy coming into effect on October 12th. It will mean that ANY extra large crate and ANY dog over 70 pounds (including crate) will no longer be permitted to go as baggage and will HAVE to go air cargo (we know all greyhound will be over 70 pounds including their crate). This is a blow to this branch as it will not cost us over \$420!! PER DOG just to travel to the Island. No adopter can be expected to pay that on top of a crate cost and the adoption fee so, where do we go from here?

I am asking **ANYONE** who has a connection to Air Canada (especially cargo division), other ideas, etc to let me know as we have to know look at what our plan will be in the future. I am going to Halifax for hound day on Sept 30th and we will get over as many dogs as we can then to keep us going for awhile. This will be our last hound day for the year, sadly enough!

I am planning on writing Air Canada to see if they can give us a break, however, I am not hopeful as I have tried this route in the past without success. We are not looking for freebees as I recognize they cannot provide that with rising costs and all but hoping to get exceptions made for our rescue group allowing them as baggage or getting a reduced cargo fee.
